How the Research Was Done

The Vietnamese Voters Alliance, a company controlled by Van Thai Tran, took possession of several thousand voter registration forms from the Orange County Registrar of Voters between 1994 and 2000.

An examination of registered voters currently on the registration rolls shows that of those who registered on the forms in Tran's company's possession, nearly twice as many are currently registered as Democrat or Decline to State.

The data obtained by independent sources can be recreated by contacting the office of the Orange County Registrar of Voters.

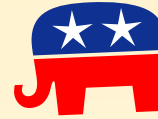



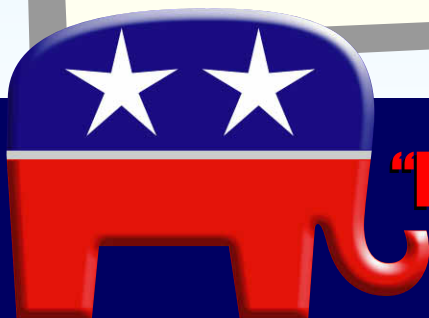
